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MBRF Discusses

"Literacy Challenge" in Egypt

The Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Knowledge Foundation (MBRF) has held a series of meetings with a number of entities and bodies in the Arab Republic of Egypt, with the aim of discussing aspects of cooperation and partnership in support of the "Literacy Challenge" project.
